

What is Comprehension Monitoring?

Comprehension Monitoring supports children and young people to:

- Identify when they have not understood information presented verbally/written.
- Identify strategies to seek help.
- Use a range of strategies to seek help.

Key Information:

- **Who is it for?** Children and Young People who have difficulties identifying when and requesting help.
- **How many children can be in a group?** 3-5 children.
- **How long is a group?** 30 minutes Weekly over a 14-week period.
- Provide visuals to support comprehension monitoring both in groups and the classroom.

What do I need?

- Saying when you don't understand programme, consisting of:
 - 14 Session Plans and Accompanying Activities/Colouring Sheets
 - Stories
 - Visual Prompts
- Colouring Pencils

What are the main elements?

- Explicitly teaching reasons for not understanding, phrases to say and supportive strategies to aid comprehension monitoring within a small group setting.
- Embedding the skill learnt in the group within the classroom by creating opportunities for the targeted skill to be generalised.
