

# What is Language for Behaviour and Emotions (LfBE)?

## Language for Behaviour and Emotions supports children to:

- Name emotions and understand the cause and meaning of these.
- Develop inferencing skills by finding clues and explaining these.
- Develop narrative skills.
- Solve people problems.

## Key Information:

- **Who is it for?** Children upper Key Stage 2 and older.
- **How many children can be in a group?** 3-5 children.
- **How long is a group?** 30-40 minutes, twice weekly, over a 12-week period.

## What do I need?

- Language for Behaviour and Emotions Book (*purchased by school*), which includes:
  - Assessment Materials; Intervention Materials; Visual Resources
  - A link to the accompanying website for further resources

## What are the main elements?

- Complete an assessment of each student in the group and score this up to identify their level:
  - Level A: Questions in the here and now.
  - Level B: Questions that require students to 'think about it' and relate the answer to their knowledge of the world.
  - Level C: Questions that require students to imagine, justify and explain.
  - Level D: Questions that require verbal reasoning and a justification.
- Select a target area for each student and complete the target sheet.
- Complete sessions at the appropriate level, keeping monitoring sheets each session.
