What is Attention **Building?**

Attend to and focus on adult directed stimuli, to

Develop natural and spontaneous communication

Attention Building supports children to:

through highly motivating activities.

develop sustained attention.

Engage in structured turn-taking • activities.

Independently complete a short • activity following an adult model.

Top Tips/Considerations:

- Who is it for? Originally developed for Autistic children to develop attention.
- How many children can be in a group? 1-4 children depending on their level of need.
- How long is a group? 5-30 minutes (depending on the number of stages)
- Consider the child's developmental level of attention to determine stages to use.
- Stay at the lowest level until a child can sustain their attention for the duration.
- Attention skills need to be taught explicitly. Keep language simple.
- Sessions need to be: Visual; Exciting; and Predictable.

What do I need?

Stage 1 - A bucket filled with motivating toys (that engage one or more of the senses).

N.B. These should not be regularly accessible to the children in the classroom

- Stage 2 A sequenced activity with an exciting end point.
- Stage 3 A motivating sensory turn-taking activity
- Stage 4 A play-based exploratory activity N.B. 1 per child

- Stage 1: Gaining and Focusing Attention
- Stage 2: Elongating/Sustaining Attention
- Stage 3: Turn Taking
