How to make revision notes

Why make notes?

- To help us to:
 - Concentrate on what you are learning
 - Understand information (by putting ideas in your own words and diagrams
 - Link new knowledge with what you know already know
 - Revise
 - Remember: It's easier to remember things when you write them down

N.B. Make sure you make your own revision notes and don't just copy from a textbook, class notes or online material.

Read

- Read the text
- Look for key words
- Look for HEADINGS, bold etc.

Cover

 Cover the text by closing the book, hiding your class notes or minimising your browser

Recall

- What can you remember?
- Try to order your thoughts
- What are the key points?

Write

- Take notes on the key points
- Have you missed anything?
- Review and edit if necessary

Top Tips:

Use | bullet points and abbreviations (abbr.) to minimise reading and writing time

Drawing boxes around any key words to make them stand out

help you
visualise the
topic
