What is a Core Board?

A core board is a form of low-tech alternative and augmentative communication (AAC).

Core vs fringe words

- Core words are the most used words in the English language.
 They are typically the first words that children learn how to speak.
 Core words include: verbs (doing words), prepositions (in, on, under), pronouns (you, I, he, she) and adjectives (big, tall, small).
- Fringe words include more personalised vocabulary that are important to the individual and specific to certain activities, topics, and environments.
 Fringe words are typically nouns (objects, people, and places).



Fringe words

Why use core boards?

- To support children to learn and use core vocabulary to communicate.
- To support the development of spoken language (rather than replacing it).
- To support the use of single word and sentence building to extend speech.
- To support and enable individuals to create new sentence structures.
- To support children where speech is difficult to understand.
- To increase participation.
- To use language flexibly across activities.
